Work Activities

The job of a BAVirtual pilot comes with its own set of responsibilities and personal commitments. Being familiar with all our Policies and Regulations as well as seeking additional training when needed or desired will be required in order to maintain the relevant knowledge required for the role.

There is much more to be a pilot rather than just flying the aircraft. Tasks can include:

- Ensuring all necessary information is received prior to departure
- Ensuring the correct fuel is loaded onto the aircraft for the given route.
- Ensuring all systems are working correctly
- Briefing the crew
- Understanding and interpreting data.
- Communicating with Air Traffic Control
- Handling every situation as it comes

Training Staff

Chief Pilots

Oversees the training for each individual mainline fleet and include former pilots, current pilots and aviation professionals.

Training Standards Captains

Provide training, advice and guidance to the line pilots for each individual mainline fleet. Report to the chief pilots and include former pilots, current pilots and aviation professionals.

Flight Managers Technical

Less hands on than the TSCs however have a more working knowledge of the aircraft so can provide guidance on documentation and operations.

The Next Step

After applying and completing the exam, you will be assigned a BAV number. This will allow you access to the BAV systems. Login to the forum, introduce yourself to the other members and have a browse.

Log in to the BAVMS and book a flight of your choice within the fleet allowances of your rank.

Download our Merlin ACARS client. Ensure you have read the manual. Fly the flight in accordance with regulations and have fun.

FAQs

- 1) How many flights do I have to complete to retain my membership? You must complete one flight, on a rolling 30-day basis.
- 2) Can I use the B737 on an A320 route?

No, you must fly the aircraft stated on the schedule. You can fly suitable substitutions as listed on the fleet page.

3) Is fuel planning done manually?

Yes, you as the pilot are responsible for the planning of the flight.

4) Do I have to fly online?

No. You can fly offline, but we do require a VATSIM ID to apply. Hours still count to your overall duty time.

5) Do I have to depart at the time stated on the schedule? No. We provide up to date mainline schedule times however the time you fly is up to you.
